

The regular meeting of the City Council was held in the Municipal Court Room on November 6, 1974 at 7:30 P.M. with Mayor Fulks presiding.

Present: Ike Fulks, W.F. McElroy, Jim Humphreys, Roy Roberts, George Hunnicutt

Also Present: Milas D. Franks, City Manager & Montie Meeks, Attorney

Minutes of the previous meeting were read and approved.

Mr. William D. Hostetler of A.A.A. Automobile Club was present at Council meeting and presented to Mayor Fulks and Chief of Police, W.A. Jones, a three year pedestrian Safety Award.

Mr. Curtis McPheron of 204 21st Street appeared before Council requesting that a traffic light be installed at the intersection of Main Avenue and 21st Street. He stated that this was a very dangerous intersection and traffic traveling on Main Avenue could not see the intersection of 21st Street far enough in advance to stop if necessary. Matter referred to the City Manager for traffic count and investigation to see if a light could be installed at this location. Mayor Fulks requested that a study be made to determine if a stop and go signal could be installed on the viaduct. Council instructed the City Manager to make the necessary investigations and to see if the two mentioned traffic light installations would be approved by the State Highway Department.

Mr. Ewing Davidson appeared before council and asked if the City was going to sell the two acre tract of property at 13th Street. The Mayor advised that he did not know at the present time.

7005

A group of Citizens from the Guest River area of Wise County appeared before Council requesting that water services be extended to their homes. Mrs. Bolling, spokesman for the group presented a petition signed by forty-eight (48) residents of the Guest River Area requesting said services. The City Manager was instructed to make a cost estimate for this extension and present same to City Council.

On motion by Roy Roberts, seconded by Jim Humphreys and carried by unanimous roll call vote, council moved to deny N.I.D.A.'s request to acquire ownership of two acre tract of land in question until such time as they show need of said property.

7007

Kenneth Wampler, City Sheriff, presented report of his work for the past 11 months and also requested that a deputy sheriff be approved for his department. No action taken by the City Council. The matter was referred to the City Manager for further investigation.

7008

Mr. Franks presented request of Lenowisco for resolution supporting Lenowisco's Right of Implementation.

On motion by W.F. McElroy, seconded by G.E. Hunnicutt and carried by unanimous roll call vote council moved to approve request of Lenowisco as set forth in their resolution. (Page 141)

7009

The City Manager presented Neighborhood Facilities Site Preparation report. Council discussed this matter briefly with Mr. Franks and advised him to proceed as previously set forth.

7010

The City Manager discussed with council Utility services to Dorchester, Bear Creek and Anderson Hollow Areas. No action taken at this time.

7011

There being no further business to come before the council same adjourned.
