

The regular meeting of the City Council was held in the Municipal Court Room on October 2, 1973 at 7:30 P.M. with Mayor Fulks presiding.

Minutes of the previous meeting were read and approved.

Mr. Franks advised council that the dog ordinance passed in March, 1969, covers the change in ordinance that council directed at September 28th Council 6398 meeting. Council was in agreement that this ordinance was sufficient.

Mr. Franks presented audit report for water construction project. Council 6399 discussed this report briefly.

Mr. Franks presented list of delinquent water, sewer & garbage bills for council's consideration in charging off.

On motion by Robert Leonard, seconded by W.F. McElroy and carried by unanimous vote council moved that water, sewer & garbage accounts as per list furnished by City Manager in the amount of \$2,772.73 be exonerated. 6400

Mr. Franks presented letter from Mr. George Warren, Attorney, regarding Old Dominion Power Company Rate increase. Council discussed this matter briefly and instructed the City Manager to contact county officials to see what steps they were going to take and then contact Mr. Warren to arrange a meeting. 6401

Mr. Franks advised council that he had an appointment with Mr. Charles McElroy, Architect, Wednesday to discuss the Neighborhood Facility Project. 6402


Mayor Fulks inquired as to status of old school residence on 11th Street. 6403
