

December 5, 1967

The regular meeting of the City Council was held in the Municipal Court Room on December 5, 1967 at 7:30 P.M. with Mayor Flanary presiding.

Present: V.O. Flanary, G.E. Hunnicutt, C.W. Bryant, R.L. Collins, S.H. Neeley

Also Present: David Norman, City Manager & Robert Stump & Leslie Mullins, Attorneys.

Minutes of the previous meeting were read and approved.

Mrs. Edwards, representing Mr. & Mrs. John Leho, Sr., appeared before Council #4233 inquiring as to status of relocating water meter and sewer line. She also inquired as to time it will take for water and sewer lines and road extension to her property approximately 200 feet from Leho property.

After discussion Council advised that these matters would be investigated by a committee of Council and City Manager.

Rescue Squad appeared before Council advising of proposal to purchase lot on #4234 9th Street. After a lengthy discussion and on motion by G.E. Hunnicutt, seconded by C.W. Bryant and carried by unanimous vote, Council moved that the Rescue Squad take this matter up with the Planning Commission.

Council discussed with Mr. Powers the financial status for proposed Elementary #4235 School to be considered in preparing new budgets.

Mr. Kanto as the City's representative on Lenowisco appeared before Council #4236 requesting that Council send a resolution to Lenowisco expressing their continuing of support and faith in Lenowisco and members of Board of Directors.

On motion by S.H. Neeley, seconded by C.W. Bryant and carried by unanimous vote, the following resolution was passed:

WHEREAS, at a regular meeting of the City Council of the City of Norton, Virginia, on the 21st day of November, 1967, by a unanimous roll call vote, the Council of the City of Norton, Virginia, moved that \$2,153.00 be appropriated to LENOWISCO from the contingency fund; therefore,

BE IT RESOLVED by the City Council of the City of Norton, Virginia, that the City of Norton asserts and affirms its confidence, support and wholehearted endorsement in the intentions, aims and ideals of LENOWISCO and the Board of Directors of LENOWISCO.

Mr. Norman presented City Manager's report. The City Manager advised Council #4237 the City is receiving maximum taxes on public utilities.

On motion by G.E. Hunnicutt, seconded by C.W. Bryant and carried by unanimous #4238 vote, Council moved that the telephone company be taxed  $\frac{1}{2}$  of 1% in such amount as permissible to State Corporation Commission and in such manner that they will not have to bill the citizens of Norton.

Councilman Flanary advised Council of the demonstration of garbage truck. #4239 He also advised the committee felt it is not feasible for City to purchase the demonstration truck.

On motion by S.H. Neeley, seconded by R.L. Collins and carried by unanimous #4240 roll call vote, Council moved that the bid of Cary Hall Company for garbage body in the amount of \$5,050 less 1% be accepted.

The City Manager advised Council that bids for chassis for garbage truck are #4241 being prepared.

Mr. Norman advised Council of workshop League Council meeting to be held in #4242 Abingdon on December 13th.

The City Manager advised Council of City's Christmas Party to be held in the #4243 Civic Room on December 21st.


The City Manager presented timber bids: Dunganon Lumber Co. • \$8,101.00;

7 On motion by G.E. Hunnicutt, seconded by S.H. Neeley and carried by unanimous  
vote, Council moved that the bid of Hammer Lumber Company in the amount of  
\$25,639.00 be accepted with the stipulation that a reasonable time for them  
to begin, preferably by June 30, 1968 and no later than December 31, 1968.


The City Manager advised Council of meeting he was in regarding #4245

unanimous vote, Council moved that the City Attorney be directed to prepare  
a resolution calling on Senator Long to get an act thru Legislator giving  
authority to relocate the State Police Office if and when it becomes  
expedient to do so.
