

April 19, 1960

The regular meeting of the City Council was held in the Municipal Court Room on the above date at 7:30 P. M. with Mayor B. E. Ball presiding.

Present: B. E. Ball, W.R. Hamner, Sol Cury, F.W. Glass

Minutes of the last meeting were read and approved.

Joe Stallard appeared before council to request that the lights on the #1643 old baseball field which are not being used now be transferred to the new baseball field in the stadium parking lot. Mr. Norton was instructed to investigate the cost and the advisability of the transfer and report back to council meeting.

On motion by Sol Cury, seconded by F.W. Glass and carried by unanimous #1644 vote, the following ordinance regarding no-parking on Park Avenue was passed on first reading:

BE IT ORDAINED by the City Council of the City of Norton, at a regular session assembled on this the 19th day of April, 1960,

THAT WHEREAS, the City of Norton has heretofore adopted an ordinance prohibiting parking of any vehicles on Park Avenue between 4th St. & 11th St. and between the hours of 4 A. M. and 6 A. M., and WHEREAS, experience has proven that these hours are not satisfactory with reference to the washing of Park Avenue, NOW, THEREFORE, be it ordained that the City Ordinance heretofore adopted be, and the same is hereby repealed.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED that it shall be unlawful to park any vehicle on Park Avenue between 4th St. and 11th S. and during the hours of 3 A. M. to 5 A. M. Any person violating this ordinance shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor and punished by a fine not exceeding \$25.00.

An emergency existing, this ordinance shall be enforced from its passage.

The City Manager reported on the work being done at Dr. Phillips' #1637 P22 residence on Highland Avenue concerning the drain.

The City Manager read a letter from Paintsville Appliance Company #1645 regarding the status of the TV Cable System into Norton.

Mr. V. B. Keys presented a petition and Check in payment of water sys- #1646 tem for 17 customers up Esserville Road.

On motion by Sol Cury, seconded by F. W. Glass and carried by unanimous vote, the City Manager was authorized to start work on the water line to these people on Esserville Road as soon as possible and any others who deposit \$150.00 with the city.

Mr. C. T. Riddle appeared before council regarding cleaning of Guest #1647 River in front of Virginia Supply Company. He was advised that this would be done at a later date.

Mr. Norton read a letter from the State Water Control Board after which #1648 the council instructed the City Manager to get a complete report on the sewage disposal system and report back to council.

On motion by W. R. Hamner, seconded by F. E. Ball and carried by unani- #1649 mous roll call/vote, the following resolution was passed:

THAT WHEREAS, FRED H. KING has been called to his eternal rest by the Ruler of the Universe, and WHEREAS, Mr. King has for the past forty years been one of Norton and Wise County's outstanding citizens, always ready, willing and able to serve his community, his county, and his Church in any capacity which was requested of him, having been a member of this Council continuously from the year 1926 until his death, with the exception of one four year term, when he was not a candidate, and also served as Vice-Mayor of his City for a number of years.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Council of the City of Norton does hereby endeavor to express the feeling of loss and emptiness which has come with his passing. His even temper, sound judgement, and lovable nature will be sorely missed in the deliberations of this Council, and we do hereby publicly extend our deepest sympathies to the members of his family who survive Him.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that a copy of this resolution be spread upon the minutes of this meeting and published in the Coalfield Progress and a copy mailed to his family.


Miss Sarah Dollarhyde appeared before council regarding pole in her #1650 driveway. Matter referred to City Manager.


Mr. Norton gave a brief report on the work that was being done by the #1651 Water Dept. and the Street Dept.
