

October 15, 1957

The regular meeting of the City Council was held in the Municipal Court Room on the above date at 7:30 P. M. with Mayor B. E. Ball presiding.

Present: B. E. Ball, Sol Cury and A. O. Umstead

Absent: Fred H. King and W. R. Hamner.

Minutes of the last meeting were read and approved.

Mr. Frank Horsman appeared before council requesting that consideration be given to having the school be responsible for the upkeep of the Norton Athletic Field instead of the City. He also inquired as to the status of his request for additional street lights in West Norton. The matter was referred to the lighting committee for report back to council. #1173

A discussion was held regarding the new impounding dam and also some statements from Chester Engineers were presented by the City Manager. Matter of statements referred to Monroe Thrower, City Auditor. #1174

Mr. Norton advised council that Mr. Wyse from the Public Housing Administration in Washington would be here, Tuesday, October 22nd and would meet with the Lions and Kiwanis Clubs at 12:00 and with the general public at 7:30 P. M. in the City Hall. #1175

Mr. Norton presented his report for the month of September, 1957. #1176

On motion by Sol Cury, seconded by A. O. Umstead and carried by unanimous vote, Council moved that taxi driver permits be issued to Henry Vanover and Haren S. Beverly. #1177

Mr. Norton advised council that the forms applying for loans for sewer project have returned to be filled out. He also advised council that the Norton Planning Commission had passed a resolution that the sewer project for the city was included in their overall plans. #1178

On motion by Sol Cury, seconded by A. O. Umstead and carried by unanimous vote of those present, Mr. Norton was appointed to replace Mr. Davis in connection with application for advance funds for sewer project. #1179

Bids for the painting of the towers in the Athletic Field were as follows: Brummitt Decorating Co. - \$1,000.00; Earl Duncan - \$1169.70; J. B. Tucker - \$800.00. #1180

On motion by A. O. Umstead, seconded by Sol Cury and carried by unanimous roll call vote of those present, the bid of J. B. Tucker in the amount of \$800.00 was accepted.

Mr. Kanto appeared before council in regard to increasing the class #1181  
rooms in the elementary school and also requested a letter from the  
City Council as to the debt limitation of this municipality and  
also the assessed valuation of all real estate in the city.

There being no further business before the council same adjourned.
