

June 5, 1952

The Town Council met on the above date in the temporary town hall at 7:30 P.M. with Mayor B.E. Ball presiding.

All members of council were present and answered to roll call.

A letter from Mr. J.J. Craigher was read requesting the issuance of a taxi-cab license and upon motion duly approved Mr. Craigher was issued a taxi license. #19

A letter from Mr. Elbert Hensley requesting an on-off premise beer license to be issued for his restaurant known as the Norton Grill was read and upon motion duly approved, the application of Mr. Hensley was approved. # 20

Mr. Wright Dawson and Mr. Hershel Bowers appeared before council requesting that a light be installed on the general location of their premises on North Craig Street. After due consideration this matter received the approval of council. #21

Mayor Ball and the town manager reported on their conferences with six architects concerning the construction of a new municipal building. Mr. McCord stated that the ability and experience of all them had been examined and he further recommended that Mr. Charles B. McElroy be employed as the architect to prepare the plans for the new municipal building. Considerable discussion followed the recommendations of Mr. McCord after which a motion prevailed that the town manager be authorized to contact an architect and have preliminary sketches prepared showing the suggested floor plans for the new municipal building. #22

Mr. McCord advised council that the 1952-53 budget for general purposes and the special levy plan had been published in the Coalfield Progress in accordance with provisions of the state laws and that a public hearing had been called for Thursday, June 19, 1952 at 7:30 P.M. in the temporary town hall. #23
