

A public hearing on the Revenue Sharing Budget for Entitlement Period #13 was held in the Municipal Court Room on Oct. 6, 1981 at 7:00 P.M.

Mayor Hunnicutt ask that City Manager present proposed uses of the budget.
The City Manager read the proposed budget in its entirety. (Insert)
Council discussed the proposed budget briefly and having no comments advised matter would be taken up in regular session.

The Mayor ask if there were any matters to be discussed before regular meeting due to time being left of public hearing before regular meeting.

Bruce Robinette of Duffield Development Authority brought council up-to-date on the authority and ask for a resolution granting concurrence to the Board of Directors appointments to Industrial Development Authority. Mayor Hunnicutt advised this would be taken up at regular session.

Council briefly discussed Highway Traffic Study which is on agenda for regular meeting.

Mayor Hunnicutt ask that council go into regular session.

On roll call the following were present: Hunnicutt, McElroy, Collier, Daniels & Jones.

Also Present: G.M. Newman, City Manager & Kenneth Asbury, Attorney

On motion by Robert Collier, seconded by W.F. McElroy and carried by unanimous vote, council moved that minutes of September 15th meeting be approved as presented.

Mr. & Mrs. Congo appeared before council requesting something be done regarding parking on 7th Street. They advised that overtime parking was not being ticketed - people working in area parking all day. Also complained of having street blocked off for too long a time for club activities. Two days was too long a time for street to be blocked - it kept people from parking to shop at their store. Council advised the Congos this matter would be referred to proper persons for action.

On motion by Daniels, seconded by McElroy and carried by unanimous roll call vote, Council moved that "A Resolution of the City Council of the City of Norton Virginia approving the Traffic Operations Study of the City of Norton, Virginia, requesting funding by the Virginia Department of Highways and Transportation and Pledging the City's Participating Share of the Cost" be passed. (Insert)

On motion by McElroy, seconded by Daniels and carried by unanimous vote, Council moved that "Resolution Granting Concurrence to Board of Directors Appointments to the Industrial Development Authority of Lee, Wise, and Scott Counties and the City of Norton, be passed. (Insert)

On motion by Collier, seconded by Jones and carried by unanimous roll call vote, the Revenue Sharing Budget as read by City Manager at Public Hearing was adopted. (Insert)

Mayor Hunnicutt introduced Bardin Thrower, Auditor for the City, who highlighted the audit for year ending June 30, 1981. He stated the audit team has a clean opinion.

He advised that Welfare had surplus of \$6500.00 Revenue Sharing Surplus of \$28,000; Gen. Oper. Fund, surplus of \$357,000 and Water & Sewer Fund deficit of \$24,000. He also stated there are costs that could't be encumbered - he highlighted them; e.g. retirement, Highways Improvements, sick leave. Remember, also that we might lose some Revenue Sharing money in future. He also commended the management for improvement in accounting and record keeping.

He then requested an executive session for personnel. Mayor said it would be taken up with item 7.

The City Manager advised council they could not secure interim financing from Farm Home until engineering is done. He ask for transfer from G.O.F. to Clear Creek Project in sum of \$80,000.00. Council discussed this matter briefly.

On motion by Daniels, seconded by Jones and carried by unanimous vote, council moved that transfer \$10,000.00 for engineering from G.O.F. to Clear Creek Project Fund on temporary transfer.

On motion by McElroy, seconded by Jones and carried by unanimous vote, Council moved they go into executive session to discuss personnel and possible pending litigation.

On motion by Daniels, seconded by Jones and carried by unanimous vote, Council moved they go back into regular session.


Mayor Hunnicutt declared council back in regular session.
