on September 7, 1976 at 7:30 P.M. with Mayor Fulks presiding. Present: Ike Fulks, W.F. McElroy, George Hunnicutt, Roy Roberts, Vernon Flanary Also Present: Milas D. Franks, City Manager Mr. Jackie Puckett, Director Nutritional Program was present, representing Marilyn Pace, Director M.E.O. Citizens regarding appointment of city representative on Mountain Empire Older Citizens Board. 7493 Mr. Nelson Sloce appeared before council requesting that the section of 10th Street between Kentucky Avenue and Locust Avenue be abondoned. He stated that he owned the property on both sides of the street. On motion by Roy Roberts, seconded by Vernon Flanary and carried by unanimous roll call vote, council moved that City of Norton Planning Commission be appointed as special committee to look at above mentioned property and make recommendations 7494 as to abandoning of same. Representatives of the Warlord Motorcycle Club were present at council meeting inquiring as to reason the police had broke their club meeting, ordered them to leave and abused individuals and destroyed some of their motorcycles. They advised they were informing the council of the matter. Council instructed the City Manager to investigate the matter and report back and also to check to see if the property 7495 in question is in the City of Norton. A group representing the Norton Rescue Squad with Kenneth Minor as spokesman appeared before council requesting council give them some aid in purchase of new vehicle. Council discussed this matter at length with the members present. They advised the Rescue Squad members that \$5,700.00 would be made available to them from their appropriated amount in the budget by December 10th. 7496 On motion by George Hunnicutt, seconded by W.F. McElroy and carried by unanimous roll call vote (Fulks, McElroy, Hunnicutt, Roberts, Flanary, Yes) council moved that the City Manager be authorized and directed to expend \$4,750.00 from water equipment expense and take the balance of \$530.00 from water contingency fund to purchase rate of flow and loss of head meter for \$5,280.00 for water plant. 7497 Council agreed to wait for passage of livestock and fowl ordinances until new 7498 attorney is employed. The City Manager reported on pigeon control. He advised there would be a representative from Commissioner of Agriculture here Thursday to advise what action 7499 may be taken to control or exterminate pigeons. On motion by W.F. McElroy, seconded by Roy Roberts, and carried by unanimous roll call vote (Fulks, Hunnicutt, Roberts, Flanary, McElroy, Yes) council moved that Mr. George Culbertson be appointed to represent the City of Norton on Mountain Em-7500 pire Older Citizens Board. On motion by Roy Roberts, seconded by W.F. McElroy and carried by unanimous roll call vote (Fulks, McElroy, Hunnicutt, Roberts, Flanary, Yes) council moved that Mr. William A. McGannon be appointed as member of City of Norton Planning Commission to fill the unexpired term of John Franklin, resigned, said term to 7501 expire July 31, 1977. On motion by George Hunnicutt, seconded by Vernon Flanary and carried by unanimous roll call vote (Fulks, McElroy, Hunnicutt, Roberts, Flanary, Yes) council moved that the City Manager be authorized and directed to borrow from Wise County National Bank a sum not to exceed \$30,000.00 for interim financing in General 7502 Operating Fund. 7503 The City Manager discussed with council contract for work on Viaduct Bridge. On motion by George Hunnicutt, Seconded by Vernon Flanary and carried by the following votes (Hunnicutt, McElroy, Fulks, Flamary, Yes; Roberts, No) council moved to ratify the allged contract between the City of Norton and Kenneth Duncan, not to exceed the sum of \$19,000.00 for sandblasting, cleaning, and painting of Viaduct Bridge. 7504 The City Manager and Councilman McElroy reported on status of water and sewer Improvement Application as submitted to Lenowisco requesting funding from A.R.C. 7505 The City Manager discussed moritorium on water connection in the Josephine area. Council instructed City Manager to make cost study of upgrading existing 7506 line to 6" plus fire protection. The City Manager reported on final review by State Health Dept. on raw water project. He advised that requests for advertised bids were to be let sometime during this week and that he hoped to have under construction during winter months. 7507 On motion by George Hunnicutt, seconded by W.F. McElroy and carried by unanimous roll call vote (Fulks, McElroy, Hunnicutt, Roberts, Flanary, Yes) council moved that resolution commending Montie Meeks as City Attorney be passed. 7508

The regular meeting of the City Council was held in the Muncipal Court Room

On motion by W.F. McElroy, seconded by George Hunnicutt and carried by unanimous roll call vote (Fulks, McElroy, Hunnicutt, Roberts, Flanery, Yes) council moved that resolution commending Andy Hamilton be passed.

The City Manager reported that he had talked to Kenneth Asbury and that he

was willing to accept appointment as City Attorney on temporary basis until he could see if he could work out an arrangement of schedule with other towns.

On motion by George Hunnicutt, seconded by Vernon Flanary, and carried by unanimous roll call vote (Fulks, McElroy, Hunnicutt, Roberts, Flanary, Yes) council moved that Kenneth P. Asbury be hired as City Attorney subject o arrangement of his schedule as stipulated at retainer fee as currently budgeted.

Mayor Fulks Advised council that Head Start School was back in Norton again this year.

There being no further business to come before council same adjourned.
