

A special called meeting of the City Council to discuss water problems of the City of Norton was held September 9, 1975 in the Municipal Court Room at 4:00 p.m. with Mayor Fulks presiding.

Present: Ike Fulks, W. F. McElroy, Jim Humphreys, Roy Roberts

Absent: George Hunnicutt

Also Present: Milas Franks, City Manager

Mayor Fulks stated that this was a special called meeting to discuss water problems of the City of Norton.

The City Manager advised the Council that effective September 8, 1975, the City had approximately 25 days supply of water remaining in the City reservoir and recommended that the City Council adopt an emergency ordinance controlling the consumption of water.

On motion by Jim Humphreys, seconded by Roy Roberts and carried by unanimous roll call vote: Ike Fulks, yes; W. F. McElroy, yes; Jim Humphreys, yes; Roy Roberts, yes; Milas Franks, yes, the following emergency ordinance was passed:

Due to the current extreme water shortage Council moved that the City Manager be authorized to regulate the consumption of water by a reduction of 30% on a daily basis on all water customers for an indefinite period of time or until supply has been replenished.

An emergency existing, this ordinance is effective from date of passage.
Passed September 9, 1975, effective September 9, 1975.
