

June 6, 1961

The regular meeting of the City Council was held in the Municipal Court Room on June 6, 1961 at 7:30 P.M. with Mayor B.E. Ball presiding.

Present: B.E. Ball, A.O. Umstead, W.R. Hamner, J.C. Holcomb

Minutes of the previous meetings were read and approved.

Wise Council and Wise water study committee with Mayor Vicars as spokesman #191 appeared before council to discuss Norton furnishing water to Wise. He suggested that an alternate line be run from Bear Creek in Norton to the Gay Dawn Acres in Wise. After a lengthy discussion, Mayor Ball advised Mayor Vicars that Norton would give them an answer within two weeks.

Miss Sarah Dollarhyde appeared before council regarding dogs destroying her #191 property. Council advised Miss Dollarhyde that the matter would be looked into.

Mr. Paul Irvin appeared before council to advise them that his wife was #191 planning to open a baby sitting service at 505 Ridge Avenue.

Jack Helms, George Hunnicutt, Thelma Phipps, Mary Jones & Isaac Fultz appeared before council regarding Power Company Franchise. A lengthy discussion #191 followed with no definite action taken.

On motion by J.C. Holcomb, seconded by W.R. Hamner and carried by unanimous #191 roll call vote, Efford Laney was granted a taxi driver's permit, to operate from 96 Cab Co.

Mayor Ball presented a letter from Mr. High Cline asking permission for the #191 issuance of an on-off premise beer license to Edna Cochran, T/A Norton Restaurant.

On motion by J.C. Holcomb, seconded by W.R. Hamner and carried by unanimous vote, permission was granted for the issuance of a beer license to Edna Cochran.

Mr. Ball read a letter from Hugh Cline about the water situation on Henry #191 Street. Mr. Cline advised council that although some were willing to pay, they thought the charge of \$100 per family unjust. This matter was referred to City Attorney.

Mr. Ball reported on the Highway Allocation Meeting in Roanoke. #1918

Mr. Ball gave a report of the status of the State Police lot. #1919

Council decided to defer the matter of appointment of a new member to the #1920 City Welfare Board until a new City Manager is employed.

On motion by A.O. Umstead, seconded by W.R. Hamner and carried by unanimous #1921 roll call vote, the following resolution regarding Dr. Glass was passed:

WHEREAS, for the past three years Frank W. Glass served the City of Norton as a loyal member of the Council; and,

WHEREAS, Frank W. Glass devoted a great deal of time and attention to the affairs of this City, going in many instances to extra effort to attend special and regular meetings, and at all times showing a great interest in

this community and its governmental affairs without bias or prejudice; and,
WHEREAS, Frank W. Glass worked diligently for the development and
improvement of this community and the Council desires that his loyalty
to the City of Norton be recorded. . .

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Council of the City of Norton,
Virginia, hereby expresses its sincere regret at the untimely death of
Frank W. Glass on the 23rd day of May, 1961; that a copy of this Resolution
be spread upon the minutes of this meeting; and that a copy of the same
be mailed to his family.
