

The regular meeting of the Norton City Council was held in the Municipal Council Chambers on Tuesday, August 7, 1990, at 7:30 p.m. with Mayor Robert Raines presiding.

Present: Linda Sturgill, Jack Wallace, Robert Raines, William Mays, and Ron McCall

Also Present: E. W. Ward, City Manager, and Kenneth P. Asbury, City Attorney

The invocation was given by City Manager Ward and was followed by the Pledge of Allegiance which was led by Fred Ramey.

Upon a motion by William Mays, seconded by Jack Wallace, and passed by unanimous vote, Council moved to adopt the minutes of the July 17, 1990 regular council meeting as presented.

Upon a motion by Jack Wallace, seconded by Ron McCall, and passed by unanimous vote, Council moved to adopt the minutes of the special called meeting of July 31, 1990. 14846

During the Mayor's call for visitors, Mr. Milford Thacker representing the Wise Chapter No. 56 of the Disabled American Veterans League presented Council with a Proclamation declaring the week of September 1st thru 7th, 1990 as its Annual Forget Me Not Campaign. 14847

Mayor Raines advised Mr. Thacker that it was his privilege to sign this proclamation.

A public hearing was held on six ordinances which will bring the City into compliance with State Law and which are the results of the 1990 Acts of the General Assembly. These ordinances are as follows: (1) An Ordinance Adopting the Motor Vehicle Code on Operating a Motor Vehicle While Under the Influence of Intoxicants, or Any Combination of Alcohol and Other Drugs, and Prescribing Tests and Penalties Therefore. (2) An Ordinance Prescribing penalties for the Conviction of Misdemeanors. (3) An Ordinance Prohibiting Profanity, Swearing, or Intoxication in Public and Penalties Therefore. (4) An ordinance Prohibiting Disorderly Conduct Having a Tendency to Cause Acts of Violence and Penalties Therefore. (5) An Ordinance Prohibiting Crossing Established Police Lines, Perimeters, or Barricades and prescribing Penalties Therefore. (6) An Ordinance Making It Unlawful to Point, Hold or Brandish a Firearm or Objects Similar in Appearance. 14848

The Mayor opened the floor for public comment.

There were no public comments on any of these ordinances and the public hearing was closed.

There were no comments from Council on any of these ordinances.

Upon a motion by William Mays, seconded by Linda Sturgill, and passed by unanimous roll call vote, Council moved to adopt An Ordinance Adopting the Motor Vehicle Code on Operating a Motor Vehicle While Under the Influence of Intoxicants, or Any Combination of Alcohol and Other Drugs, and Prescribing Tests and Penalties Therefore. (Insert)

Upon a motion by Ron McCall, seconded by William Mays, and passed by unanimous roll call vote, Council moved to adopt An Ordinance Prescribing Penalties for the Conviction of Misdemeanors. (Insert)

Upon a motion by Jack Wallace, seconded by William Mays, and passed by unanimous roll call vote, Council moved to adopt An Ordinance Prohibiting

Profanity, Swearing, or Intoxication in Public and Penalties Therefore. (Insert)

Upon a motion by William Mays, seconded by Ron McCall, and passed by unanimous roll call vote, Council moved to adopt An Ordinance Prohibiting Disorderly Conduct Having a Tendency to Cause Acts of Violence and Penalties Therefore. (Insert)

Upon a motion by Jack Wallace, seconded by William Mays, and passed by unanimous roll call vote, Council moved to adopt An Ordinance Prohibiting Crossing Established Police lines, perimeters, or Barricades and Prescribing Penalties Therefore. (Insert)

Upon a motion by Ron McCall, seconded by William Mays, and passed by unanimous roll call vote, Council moved to adopt An Ordinance Making It Unlawful to Point, Hold or Brandish a Firearm or Objects Similar in Appearance. (Insert)

Mr. Ward pointed out that there were still two additional ordinances on the Virginia Indoor Clean Air Act and Bingo/Raffle Permits to be brought before Council and the City Attorney advised there were four or five more to come regarding the Police Department.

Mr. Bobby Lane and Lee Maddox of Dewberry and Davis were present and gave Council an update on Contract IV of the C-N-W Wastewater Authority and Related Infiltration/Inflow Abatement.

Mr. Maddox advised that the pumping station alternative was more cost effective and would reduce the City's Inflow/Infiltration by 600,000 gallons per day and would relieve the moratorium placed on the City by the State Water Control Board for sewer connections. He further advised Council that the total cost for Contract IV and the I/I Project totaled \$1,938,865 of which \$1,938,000 the City would have in loans.

The Contract IV Project would be administered by the C-N-W Regional Sewer Authority and Mr. Ward advised Council that the City Administration requests that the Authority also handle the administration of the I/I Project also.

Following a brief discussion, Council advised Dewberry and Davis to proceed with Contract IV and the Inflow/Infiltration Project as discussed with both projects to be administered by the C-N-W Regional Sewer Authority.

Mr. Ward advised a public hearing has been advertised to be held August 21st which will be attended by the State Water Control Board. Bids will be advertised August 25th.

Upon a motion by William Mays, seconded by Ron McCall, and passed by unanimous vote, Council moved to go into Executive Session to discuss personnel as per 2.1-344 (A) (1) of the Code of Virginia, as amended.

Mayor Raines declared the meeting in Executive Session.

Upon a motion by William Mays, seconded by Jack Wallace, and passed by unanimous vote, Council moved to go back into regular session.

Mayor Raines declared the meeting back in regular session.

The Clerk then polled each member of Council as to the Certification of Executive Session with each member answering aye. The Clerk then read the entire Resolution of the Certification of Executive Meeting.

Upon a motion by William Mays, seconded by Jack Wallace, and passed by unanimous vote, Council moved to adopt A Resolution of the Certification of Executive Meeting. (Insert)

Mayor Raines opened the floor for nominations to the City of Norton Planning Commission for a four year term to expire July 31, 1994.

Ron McCall nominated Mr. Robert Isaac for reappointment to the Planning Commission.

unanimous vote, Council moved that the nominations cease.

Mayor Raines declared Robert Isaac reappointed to the City of Norton Planning Commission for a four year term which will expire July 31, 1994.


In his comments, the City Manager advised the photo session which was scheduled for August 21st had to be cancelled and would rescheduled either September 4th or 18th.

Vice Mayor Mays advised that the fourth annual Car Show would be held Saturday, August 11th at Market Place. He expressed his appreciation for the community support during this event.


