

An emergency meeting of the City Council was held in the Municipal Court Room on October 26, 1978 at 3:00 P.M. with Mayor Hunnicutt presiding.

Present: George Hunnicutt, W.F. McElroy, Robert Collier, Cliff Daniels, Frank Fischer.

Mayor Hunnicutt stated purpose of meeting is to consider passing of an emergency ordinance covering use of water.

Mayor Hunnicutt ask the City Manager to bring them up-to-date on water supply. The City Manager presented report as prepared by Ralph Gilly, Water Plant Operator. Mr. Gilly was present and discussed this matter at length with Council. Council directed the City Manager to contact Health Department in Abingdon to have them send one of their representatives over to make tests of different locations where it would seem possible to obtain an additional supply of water.

Mayor Hunnicutt read the proposed ordinance in its entirety.

On motion by Frank Fischer, seconded by Cliff Daniels and carried by unanimous vote, Council moved that the ordinance be amended by striking Section D in its entirety and adding another section to read: "That the City Manager be directed to regulate the consumption of water by a reduction of 30% on a daily basis on all water customers for an indefinite period of time or until supply has been replenished."

Cliff Daniels moved that Paragraph (a) of Section 2 be deleted. Motion failed for lack of second.

On motion by Frank Fischer, seconded by Cliff Daniels and carried by unanimous vote Council moved that "Ordinance Declaring an Emergency and Restricting the Use of Water by the Citizens of the City of Norton and Users of the City Water Supply be passed as amended."
